## Jacob Cooke and William Cooke

Jacob or "Jake" began making concrete blocks by hand in the 1940s.

"Bill" was born in 1931 and passed away in 2005. He became President of the National Concrete Producers Association and a Director of the Concrete Masonry Association of the United States.

By 1960 Aldershot's "J. Cooke Concrete Blocks" was the largest automated concrete facility in Canada and the British Empire.

The father and son Cooke team built 900 new homes in the Bay area, many in Aldershot, including "Birdland", Fairwood Place West, and Oaklands Park Court. They produced concrete slabs and wall panels used in constructing Burlington City Hall, Hamilton Place and the swimming pool at McMaster University.

Bill developed the Cooke Business Park on Cooke Boulevard in Aldershot and provided inspirational leadership in the effort to construct a full interchange at Waterdown Road and Highway 403.
